NOVEMBER 2012

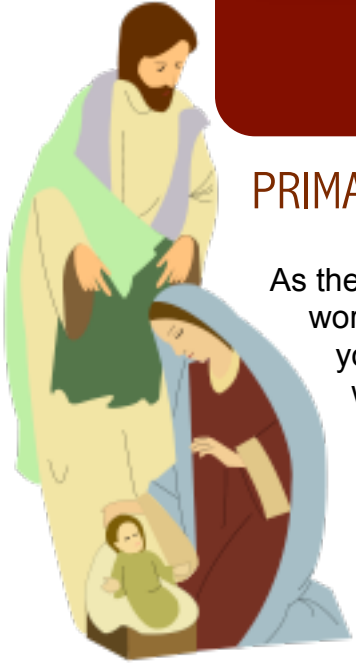
PRIMARY

 - How are homes powered by energy?
 - How could this energy be modified to improve the quality of life for future generations?

PRIMARY

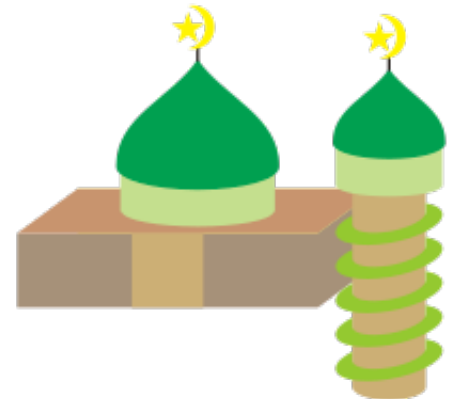

SECONDARY

- Name the religious institutions that have marked the heritage of your nation.
- Describe different religious traditions (rituals, rules, fundamental elements).
- What expressions of religion are present in your environment?

PRIMARY

Air

- What are the means put in place to reduce air pollution?

- What are the means of transport used to reduce air pollution?

Water

- Where does drinking water?
- How water is filtered it to become drinkable?
- How is drinking water in homes it delivered?

SECONDARY

Forests

- Describe the different types of forests.
